### The Patricia A. Thomas Educational Scholarship For High School Seniors: Scholarship Award Total for 4 years of Matriculation \$4000

The Patricia A. Thomas Educational Scholarship is a monetary award for High School Seniors who, having met the criteria below, will receive a 4 year award of \$1,000. Applicants must be matriculated at an accredited College or University.

This application must include the applicant's high school transcript, a copy of the college/university acceptance letter, a current résumé, at least two (2) letters of reference and a 1000 word essay. Essay topics should be based on current events relative to civil and social justice, community and economic empowerment and leadership development. Eligibility for this award is as follows:

- Exemplary record of a 3.0 GPA
- A record of community service/extracurricular activities
- College/University acceptance letter
- Evidence of financial need (if applicable )
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- A selection of a major in Education preferred

## <u>The Science, Technology Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) Scholarships For High</u> School Seniors: Scholarship Award \$2000

The STEAM Scholarship is a monetary award for High School Seniors who may have participated in our partnership programming with the NAACP, United Nations Model UN Program or a Greater Queens (NY) Chapter of The Links, Incorporated, i.e. Services to Youth, National Trends, International Trends, Arts, or Health & Human Services Facet program, who have met the criteria below. Scholarship recipients will receive a one-time award of a maximum of \$2000 for confirmed matriculation in an accredited College or University with a desired degree in the Sciences or Mathematics.

This application must include the applicant's high school transcript, a copy of the college acceptance letter, a current résumé, at least two (2) letters of reference and a 1000 word essay. The essay topics should be based on current environmental issues, sustainability, other science or math related topics and or a topic related to economic empowerment and leadership development. Eligibility for this award is:

- Exemplary record of academic success throughout High School
- A record of community service/extracurricular activities (optional)
- Extensive participation in STEM related activities/competitions (ex. Robotics Team, Math Olympiads, Computer Science clubs etc.)
- College/University Acceptance Letter
- Evidence of financial need (preferred)
- Excellent communication skills both written and verbal
- A selection of a major in STEM required

# <u>The Science, Technology Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM) Scholarships For High School Seniors: Scholarship Award \$2000</u>

The STEAM Arts Scholarship is a monetary award for High School Seniors who have met the criteria below will receive a one time award in the amount of \$2000 for confirmed matriculation in an accredited College or University with a desired degree in the Arts. Eligibility for this award is as follows:

This application must include the applicant's high school transcript, a copy of the college acceptance letter, a current résumé, at least two (2) letters of reference and a 1000 word essay. Essay topics should take an artistic approach on current events relative to civil and social justice; environmental issues, sustainability, theater, music, entertainment and or community and economic empowerment and leadership development.

• Exemplary record of academic success throughout High School

- A record of community service/extracurricular activities
- Extensive participation and awards in the Arts at School or extracurricular activities/competitions (ex. Band, Orchestra, Team competitions, Musicals etc.)
- College/University Acceptance Letter
- Evidence of financial need (if applicable)
- Excellent communication skills both written and verbal
- A selection of a STEAM/Arts major is required.

### The HBCU Stop GAP Scholarship For College University Students: Scholarship Award Varies

This scholarship is awarded to prospective graduating student(s) who are enrolled in their final semester and who are prevented from graduating because of a minimal amount of money owed the institution from which he/she is scheduled to graduate. The student must have a minimum 2.0 to 2.5 GPA and provide proof of outstanding funds needed. The range in the amount of the scholarship awarded is dependent upon the student's need. The amount awarded will not exceed \$2000 and may be awarded to several students annually.

This application must include the applicant's College/University transcript, a current résumé, at least two (2) letters of reference and a 1000 word essay. Essays should indicate why the student is deserving of the award and must include future goals, educational opportunities/endeavors, graduate school, internships, employment etc.

- A record of community service/extracurricular activities
